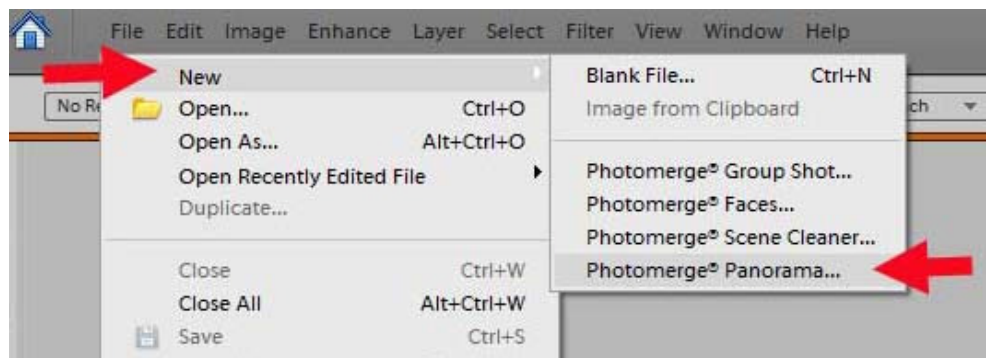


Sometimes we have to scan things that are larger than the scanner bed. That means taking multiple scans to get all portions of the document, then ‘stitching’ or merging them together to make a single image. With PSE7/8 this is easier than ever!

MAKING A PHOTOMERGE

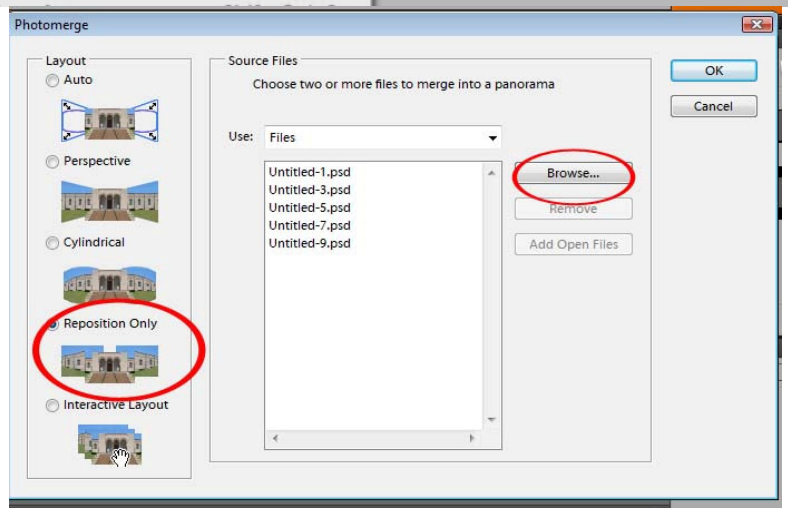
Once you’ve scanned and saved your images (you can save them as .psd files) you’re ready to go. Be sure your scans cover every little bit of the image, there should be a lot of overlap.

1. Go to File> New> Photomerge
Panorama



2. You will get a dialog box where you can choose your photos. Click Browse, and navigate to where you’ve stored your scanned files. Select all the scans that apply to the single image you wish to create.

3. Click on the Reposition Only option at the left, and then click OK.



4. Now the program does its magic! It will open each file and merge them. This can take a while, so be patient. When it's done, you'll be left with this:

You can see by the masks on each layer which part of each image was used to make the merge!

Save this as a .jpg and you're done!
